Getting Started

1. While listening to the sermon, were you challenged in any way to think differently? If so, how?

Receive the Word

2. Read [John 15:1-17](#).
 - a. In one or two sentences, describe the big idea of what Jesus is communicating in these verses.
 - b. What do verses 9-12 communicate about joy and obedience?
 - c. What does it *mean* and *look like* to love as Jesus has loved you?

Make the Connection

3. Communion fellowship is friendship love. Friendship love among brothers & sisters in Christ is affectionate, relational, loyal, committed, & self-sacrificing.
 - a. How have you received this kind of love from someone?
 - b. What does friendship love look like in our Life Group/Church Family?
4. Communion fellowship is others-focused.
 - a. Go around the group and ask each person to share about how they would evaluate one of the following questions in their life:

(OVER)

- Is being friends with me encouraging this sister or this brother in evangelism?
- Am I exhorting them to be more prayerful and a more devoted student of the Scriptures?
- Am I prompting them to be a better friend to others?
- If they're married, am I urging them to be a better spouse?
- If they're single, am I helping them to feel the love of family?
- If they have kids, am I resourcing them to be a better parent?
- If they have aging parents, am I helping them to be a caring son or daughter?
- Am I someone who draws my friends toward materialism, or am I someone who inspires them to be more generous?

b. What might God be calling you (or our Life Group) to do in order to love others outside of the church?
